

Double Star

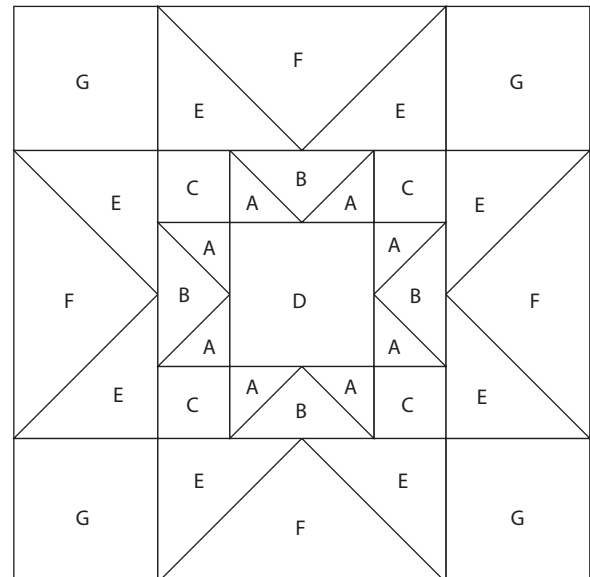

Its really hard for me to pick my favorites when it comes to star blocks, but this Double Star block is at the top for sure. Part of it is because I get to squeeze in two stars into one block, and part of it is because that gives me more fabrics to play with!



Cutting Instructions

Qty	6" finished block	12" finished block
4	1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares (A)	2 $\frac{5}{8}$ " squares (A)
1	3" square (B)	4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square (B)
4	1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares (C)	2" squares (C)
1	2" square (D)	3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square (D)
4	2 $\frac{5}{8}$ " squares (E)	4 $\frac{1}{8}$ " squares (E)
1	4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square (F)	7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square (F)
4	2" squares (G)	3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (G)

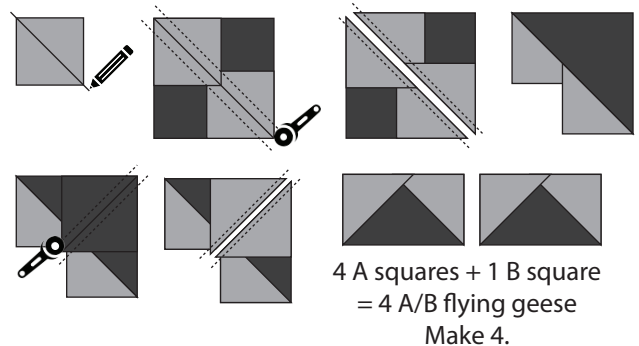
Piecing Instructions

Step 1

On the wrong side of each A square, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.

With right sides together, align 2 A squares in opposite corners of the B square.

Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the square apart on the line to yield 2 partial flying geese units, and press the seams to the A triangles.



With right sides together, align another A square in the corner of the B triangle as shown.

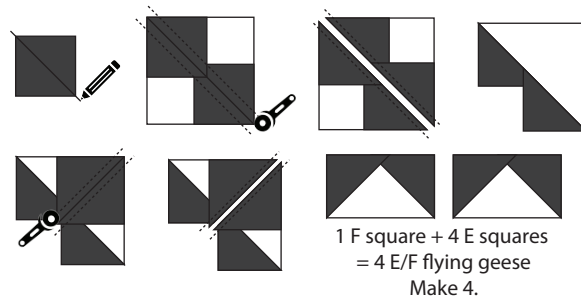
Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the square apart on the line to yield 2 complete flying geese units, and press the seams to the A triangles.

Repeat to make 4 A/B flying geese units. Trim to $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x 2" (6" block) or 2" x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " (12" block).

Step 2

Using the E and F squares, repeat Step 1 to make 4 E/F flying geese units.

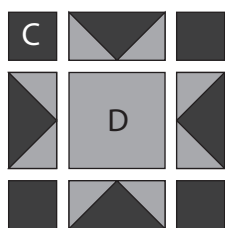
Trim to 2" x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " (6" block) or $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " (12" block).



Step 3

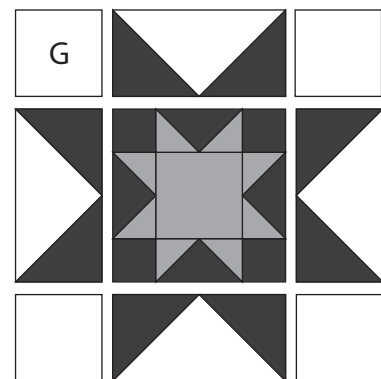
Lay out the C squares, A/B flying geese, and the D square as shown. Join units to make the block center.

Trim to $3\frac{1}{2}$ " (6" block) or $6\frac{1}{2}$ " (12" block).



Step 4

Lay out the G squares, the E/F flying geese, and the block center as shown. Join units to make the full block. Trim to $6\frac{1}{2}$ " or $12\frac{1}{2}$ ".
